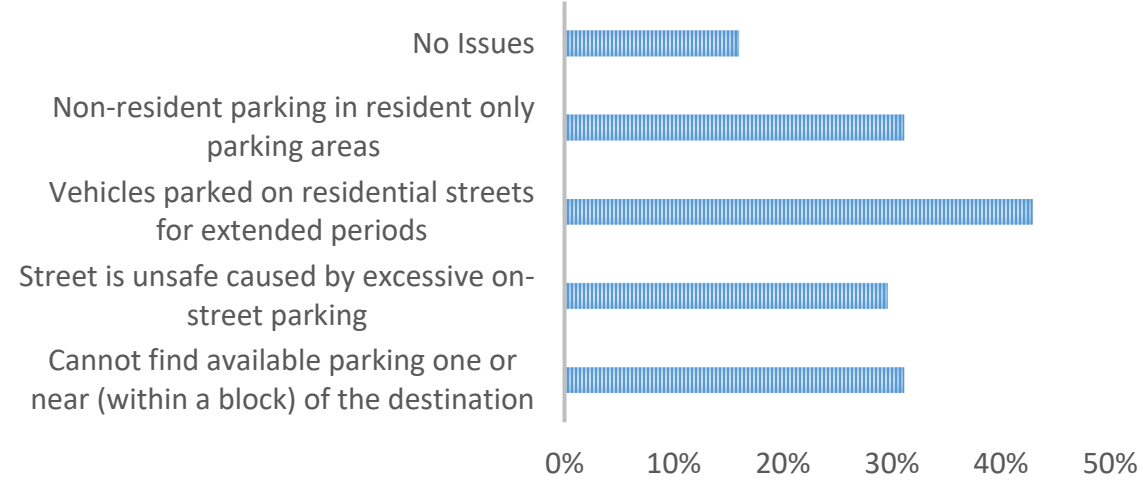


Distribution of Respondents

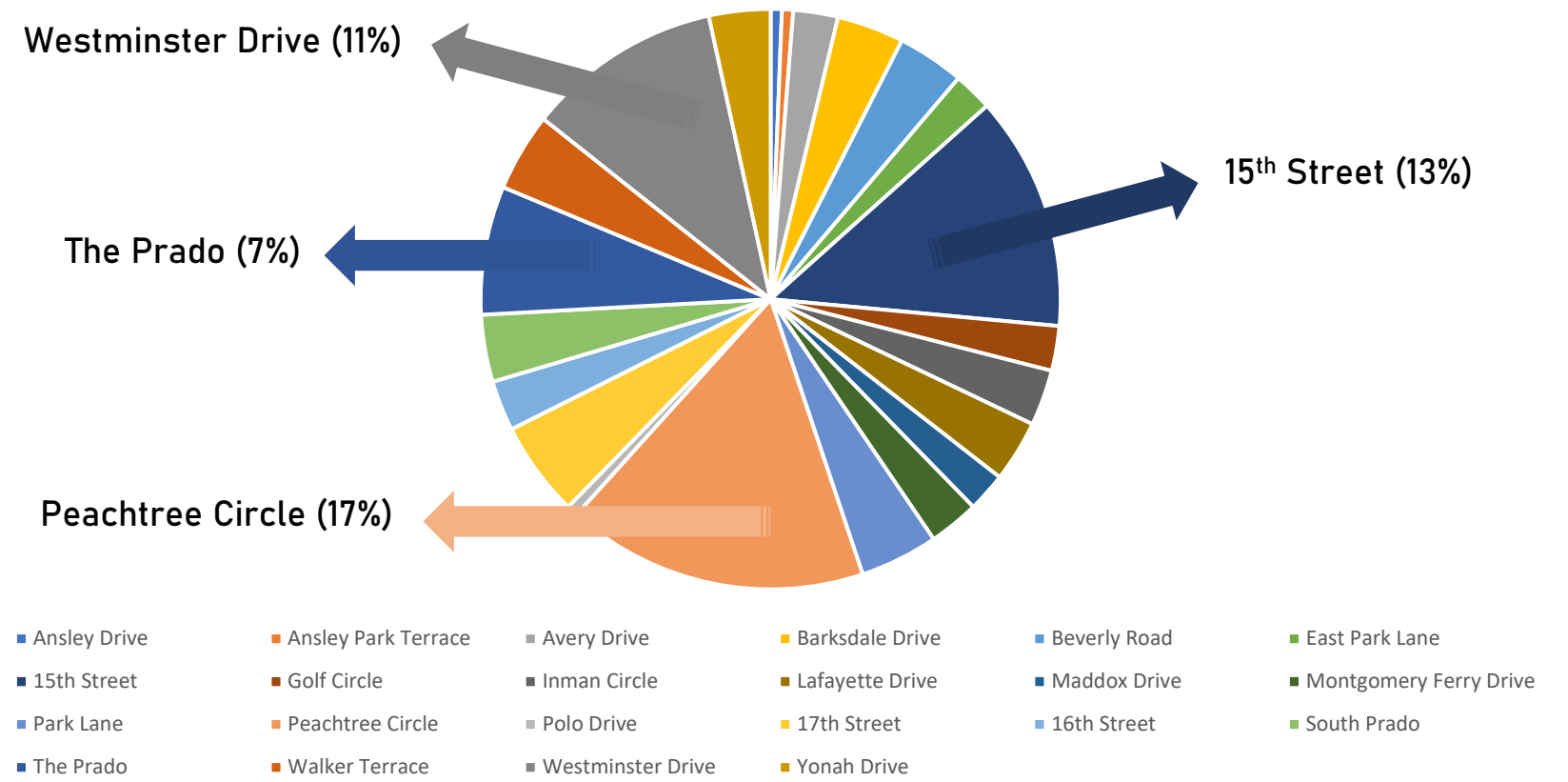


What are the biggest parking challenges you experience in Ansley Neighborhood?



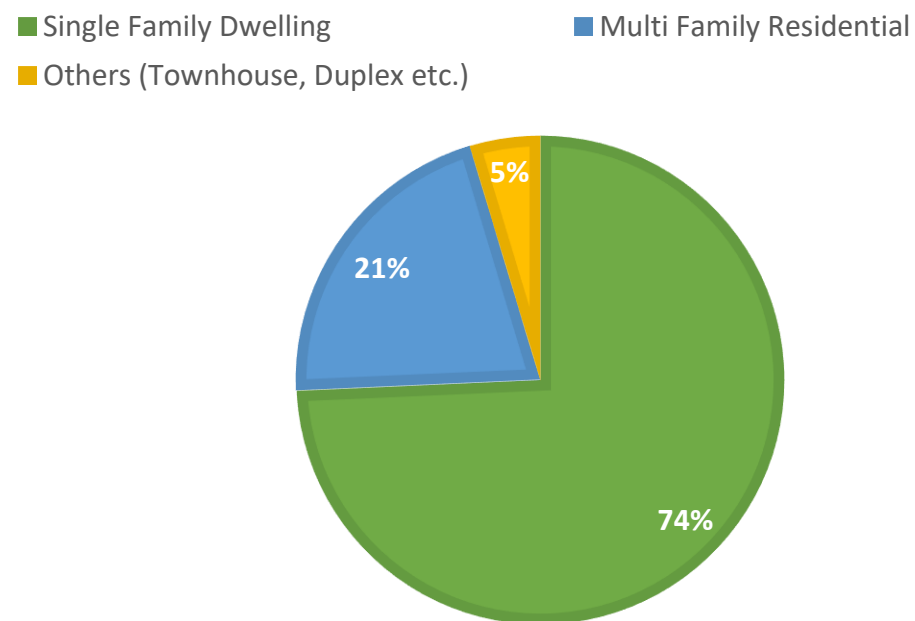
Ansley Parking Survey Results

Would you like to see a change in parking regulations for a particular street in the neighborhood (other than yours)?



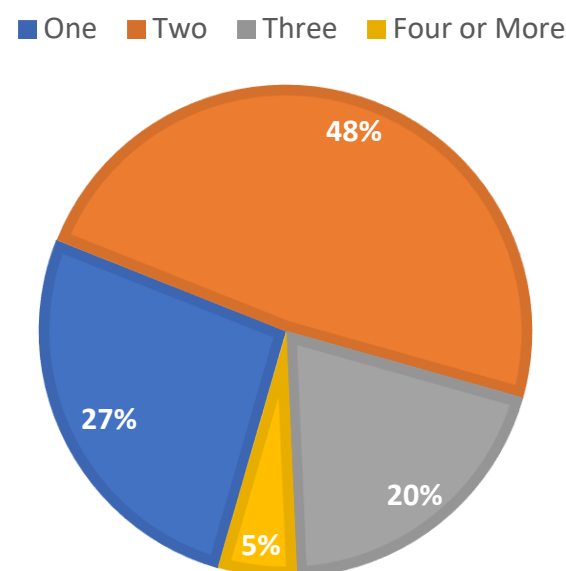
What type of household do you live in?

Most respondents live in Single Family Dwellings with multi family residential respondents concentrated towards Piedmont Avenue NE, Peachtree Circle and 15th Street.



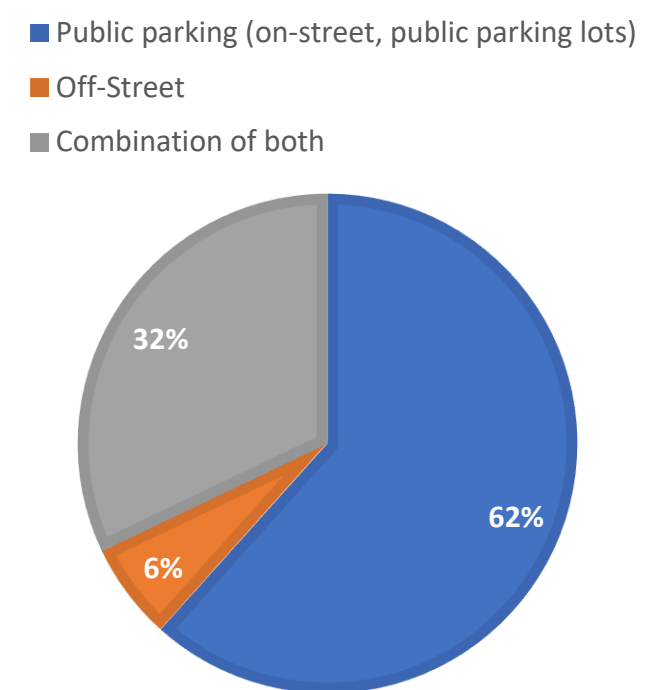
How many privately owned vehicles do you own or lease?

Two cars is the most common ownership class with an even distribution across the neighborhood. A cluster of higher car ownership (> 4) is present in Peachtree Circle NE. Additionally, on street parking is more prevalent in the peripheral streets with most respondents preferring to park in their private driveway / garage.



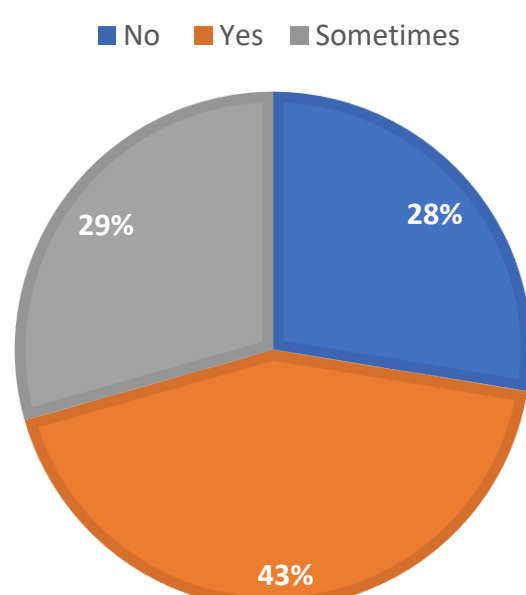
Where do guests and contractors park?

Most guests and contractors park on the street and in public parking lots.



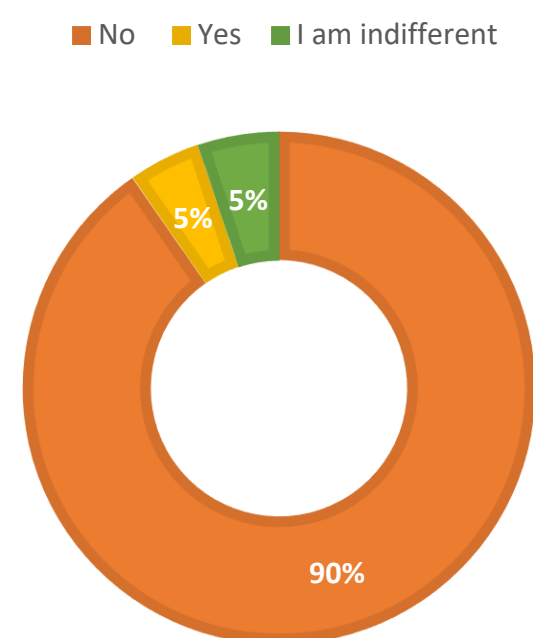
Do you feel there is adequate parking supply for your guests or contractors?

43% of respondents felt adequate parking is an issue and these were evenly distributed across the neighborhood. Most respondents from The Prado and Maddox Drive NE felt that parking was not an issue.



Would you like to see paid parking on your street?

Overwhelming majority of residents would not like to see paid permit parking on their street.
